COLLEGE FACILITIES

CORE INFRASTRUCTURE:

1. Library: The College Library provides print & electronic resources for all academic and related activities of the students and staff, services for the retrieval and use of these resources and adequate infrastructure and spaces for their use. The Library of the College has well equipped and spacious Reading Room Facility. The Library has a paperback collection, newspapers and magazines reading facilities, the Issue & Return Counters as well as reading spaces. An online database of the books and journals is maintained and access to these is provided through OPAC (On-line Public Access Catalogue) terminals in the library and a link on the College website. The library also has access to online catalogues, database such as N -LIST and digital library. The library has a collection of books, journals, magazines, daily Newspapers, CDs/DVDs, E-Resources, Newspaper Clippings and special collections. The Library introduced barcode based computerized circulation system with the help of ILMS Koha. Library collections are searchable through WEBOPAC, Cloud based Online Searching of Library Resources with the help of ILMS KOHA, and E-Resource Access Section provides internet facility with Wi-Fi & LAN Connectivity. The Library subscribed to INFLIBNET (Information and Library Network) through N-LIST Program (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) The Library provides Book Bank facility. The library provides current-awareness service to the readers through new arrivals display and announcement posters. Each shelf is accompanied with shelf guide, which indicates shelf number, class number and subjects concerned. It procures print periodicals including both journals and magazines and provides previous year Semester Questions and Syllabus. A corner for competitive examinations and career guidance has also been added for the students. Book, journals, magazines, newspapers relating to different competitive examinations such as UGC, CSIR NET/SET, IAS, Career / Service Oriented programs and other documents related to the subjects are available for consultation in the library.

2. Laboratories:

General Biotechnology Laboratory- The Department of Biotechnology is actively involved in academic hands-on experiments for the undergraduate students. This Laboratory is funded by Shri George Baker, (MP) under MPLAD fund. The main focus of this laboratory is to provide the basic and advanced instrument facilities to the students to inculcate the scientific aptitude in Cell and Molecular Biology, Genetics, Recombinant DNA Technology, Plant Anatomy and Physiology, to enrich their practical knowledge in their pursuit of biotechnological research.

Microbiology Laboratory- The Microbiology laboratory of the Department of Biotechnology was established on 2021. This Laboratory provides basic instrumentation facilities to the students for performing microbiological experiments. The Department introduced this separate laboratory to conduct the students' practical simultaneously with

other scheduled practical classes of the academic curriculum without any kind of interruption.



Biochemistry Laboratory- the Biochemistry laboratory of the Department of Biotechnology was established on 2021 for the purpose of conducting Chemistry and Biochemistry related practical classes. The laboratory provides good infrastructure with proper ventilation system for analyzing the biochemical compounds both qualitatively and quantitatively.

Plant Tissue Culture and Phyto-chemistry laboratory. The Department of Biotechnology established a research laboratory in Plant Tissue Culture and Phyto-chemistry on 2019 when the Administrative Block was inaugurated. This laboratory was introduced mainly for the purpose of Faculties research and students' projects; also for conducting training programs and workshops related to Plant Tissue Culture and Phyto-chemistry.

Geography Laboratory- Geography Laboratory is used for Physical Geography teaching-learning of papers like Geomorphology, Climatology and Soil & Bio-Geography. The laboratory contains all Topographical Maps, Aerial Photography and Satellite Imagery for landscape survey purpose. It contains Geomorphological models and Maps needed for understanding different concepts. The laboratory has a rich collection of different specimens of Minerals, Metallic Ores, Rocks and Rock-forming minerals. The laboratory has apparatus like Rain Gauge, Thermometer, Barometer and Hygrometer, Soil Testing Kit (Palintest SKW500), pH meter with other supporting equipments.

Remote sensing and GIS Laboratory conducts studies on various aspects using remote sensing and GIS techniques. The laboratory is equipped with software for Remote sensing, Digital Image Analysis and GIS. The laboratory is equipped with Handheld Garmin GPS to determine location in latitude, longitude and altitude. The laboratory contains Mirror Stereoscope for viewing a stereoscopic pair of separate images, depicting left-eye and right-eye views of the same scene as a three-dimensional image.

For cartography paper, the laboratory is equipped with instruments such as Dumpy Level, Prismatic Compass, Theodolite with other supports like Ranging Rod, Staff, Ground Pin, Measuring Tape etc. It has Abney Level, Clinometer, Planimeter as well.





Computer Science Laboratory – The Department of Computer Science and Application provides two well-equipped air-conditioned Computer Laboratories with well-configured machines with the aim to cater to the needs of the students. Our department also provides one Hardware Laboratory with several Digital Kits where students can perform their hardware related practical.

Communication Laboratory - SXCB is well-equipped with Communication Laboratory with numbers of well- configured computers with the aim to provide ample amount of exposure needed.





- **3.** Common Rooms It gives students relief from the stress and strain of continuous Classes. There is a separate common room for girls in the ground floor of administrative Building in our college
- **4. Hostel:** Hostel accommodation is available only for boys at a limited number

- **5.** Canteen This is a spacious area with a view of greenery. A variety of refreshments and meals are available here at subsidized rates. Special attention is taken to maintain quality of food hygiene. Fresh and filtered drinking water is supplied in the College Canteen as well as in every floor. It is a place on the campus not only for leisure and refreshment but also for students to bond & discuss.
- 6. Indoor Games Room As part of our commitment to ensure all-round development and a holistic experience for the students, St. Xavier's College has chosen to support and develop sport and recreation facilities at all levels of participation. And for this purpose, the college has a indoor games room inside the campus with facilities for Table Tennis, Carrom, Chess, etc.
- 7. Seminar Halls Two air-conditioned seminar halls to accommodate 400 persons are available at the Academic Building & Administrative Building for conducting various programs, seminars and conferences. The hall is equipped with state-of-the art audio-visual equipment. Additionally a new multipurpose hall has been set up named as Loyala Multipurpose hall. All the interactive sessions and the interface with the experts from different institutions and the corporate world take place in this hall.





8. Smart Classrooms - Smart classroom fosters opportunities for teaching and learning by integrating latest technology, designed and equipped with the modern teaching facilities like complete terminals with internet, LCDs, Projectors and public address

system.



- 9. Conference Rooms Two air-conditioned conference halls are available at the Academic Building & Administrative Building for conducting various meetings, conference.
- **10. Counseling Centre-** It provides Personal Counseling, Mock Interviews for better Personal and Social Adjustment; Personality Evaluation Tests for Self-Improvement; Vocational Testing; Information on Careers.
- 11. Facilities for Differently-abled persons- The College is equally sensitive to the needs and requirements of differently-able persons. It has extended cooperation and ensured special facilities to minimize their difficulties and challenges. The following are some of the special provisions made for them: Seats are reserved as per Government rules, Tuition fee waived, Lifts, Ramp Facility and wheel chair, Accessible Toilets, Extra Time and amanuensis is provided during examinations as per rules, Library staff Assistance to access required books., Vehicles are arranged to reach the Examination centre.
- 12. Interfaith Prayer Hall: The interfaith prayer and meditation rooms are meant to serve and support all students and the holistic wellness of the college community. This space allows individuals of all religious faiths and non-religious beliefs to experience a place for peace, prayer, meditation and/or quiet reflection throughout the day. The spaces are intended for individual use and not for any organized group activity or meetings. The interfaith prayer and meditation rooms are not reservable and are available for individual students to use whenever the campus building is open.



- **13. Career Counseling & Placement Cell:** The Placement Cell of St. Xavier's College, Burdwan creates a platform where students can showcase their talents which different companies seek to explore and utilize. Campus placement drives are organized via Job fairs every year. Students from other colleges also participate in the placement drives of our college.
- **14. Students' Mentoring:** All departments actively mentor students on a regular basis catering to the academic and psychological needs of the students. Each student of each department is assigned to a mentor in every academic session.
- **15. Internet Facility-** Wi-Fi & Internet facilities is available in college campus. There is a specially designed E-Resource room where students can access computers and internet for inculcating knowledge. Every floor of the college building has Wi-Fi router with good internet connectivity, all the system at the laboratory, library and staff room has internet connection and most of the departments and office are connected by LAN.







CORE FORUMS:

STUDENTS' COUNCIL: The student council is the non-political representative body of the entire student community of the St. Xavier's College, Burdwan. It aims at the all-round development of students and organizes several extra-curricular events throughout the year. Student council also coordinates the student's volunteer effort for the college events that are organized periodically. It provides opportunities with the students to express their social concern and social responsibility towards the larger society, especially the downtrodden.

AICUF: Inspired by Gospel values, the AICUF, a national youth organization, gives students an opportunity to develop an all-round personality through leadership training, social outreach, spiritual integration and cultural activities. Conscientized on burning issues like women empowerment and ecological imbalance, its members are geared to taking a stand for the liberation of marginalized groups and Mother Earth. The AICUF facilitates the College Choir and with the DIRS organizes the Inter-Faith Prayer Services and Masses. Its national slogan is 'We are born into an unjust society and we are determined not to leave it as we have found it'. True to the concept of 'Catholic' which means 'Universal', the approach of the AICUF is inclusive.

NSS- The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government-sponsored public service program conducted by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and the sports of the Government of India in the year 1969. NSS is a voluntary association of young people studying in universities, colleges, and at the 10+2 level. There is one unit of NSS. This scheme is provided so that students may learn to be men for others through service to the people around them. They have annual camps in villages in the district where they learn to relate with people, understand their difficulties and help them and solutions to their problems. A generous heart, a creative mind and a sensitive conscience is what we require from those who want to make a difference in the lives of others. The outcome is, while making a difference in others' lives, they make a difference in their own lives.

X-EVE (The Women's Cell) - In the effort to make SXCB a strong kernel of Women empowerment and gender equality, the X-EVE cell was constituted with an aim to create a gender sensitized community within campus as well as in the society. It coordinates programmes for awareness and action on women's issues. It also coordinates with ICC & Grievance Redressal Cell for complaints of sexual harassment or discrimination.

ACADEMICS

AFFILIATION: The College is affiliated to the University of Burdwan.

B. A. / B.Sc./B.Com/BBA/BCA MAJOR COURSES (HONOURS) UNDER NEP

According to The University of Burdwan, under the CCFUP NEP the main components of the courses are as follows:

"Academic Year" means a year from July to June, i.e., the period commencing from 1st day of July of a year and ending on 30th June of the following year.

"Academic Session" means the actual tenure of the programme i.e., the period commencing from the 1st day of July of the 1st Academic Year and ending on 30th June of the final Academic Year. [e.g., the Academic Session 2023-2026 of 3- Year Degree Programme means the period commencing from the 1st day of July, 2023 and ending on 30th June, 2026. Similarly, the Academic Session 2023-2027 of 4-Year Honours Programme means the period commencing from the 1st day of July, 2023 and ending on 30th June, 2027.]

"Semester" means a period of six months i.e., July to December and January to June of each academic year. There will be a minimum 15 weeks (6-day week) of teaching-learning in each semester.

EXPLANATION OF THE COURSES

Candidates, admitted to Four Year under Graduate Programmes, shall have to opt for the Subject(s)/Courses/Group of Courses as prescribed by the appropriate authorities of the University from time to time. The present Programme Structures are as follows:

Major Subject: Major subject is the subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that subject. Students should earn the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses in the major subject.

Minor Subject: Minor subject helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major subject. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics/History, then the student will be awarded B.Sc./B.A. degree in Economics with Minor in Statistics/History as the case may be.

Students having Major in Accounting & Management/Business Administration/ Business Administration (T&H)/Computer Applications /Fine Arts shall study the Minor Courses as prescribed in the syllabus of the subject concerned instead of choosing another subject/courses as Minor.

Modality of selection of Minor Subject: A student of 4-Year Hons. Programme under CCFUP shall have to study nine (9) Minor Courses (4 Credits each) of which three (3) Minor Courses shall be studied in 1st, 4th & 7th Semesters on a single subject chosen by him/her in Semester I, three (3) Minor Courses shall be studied in 2nd, 4th & 8th Semesters on another subject chosen by him/her in Semester II and three (3) Minor Courses on Vocational Education &

Training shall be studied. For this purpose, the University Authority will issue notice prior to commencement of the Semester III mentioning the modality of teaching-learning of such courses from time to time.

Vocational Education and Training will form an integral part of the undergraduate programme to impart skills along with theory and practical. A minimum of 12 credits will be allotted to the "Minor" stream relating to Vocational Education and Training and these can be related to the major or minor subject or choice of the student.

Multi/Inter Disciplinary (MDC): The students will undergo courses in multi/inter disciplinary category to have basic knowledge not only in major areas but also in other disciplines broadly grouped under (Natural and Physical Sciences), (Mathematics, Statistics, Computer Science and Computer Applications), (Library, Information and Media Sciences), (Commerce and Management), and (Humanities & Social Sciences).

Modality of selection of a subject for Multi/Inter Disciplinary Courses: A student shall have to study three (3) courses on a single subject in the field of Multi/Inter Disciplinary in 1st, 2nd & 3rd semesters. Broad disciplinary category of Multi/Inter Disciplinary subjects must be different from the Broad disciplinary category(ies) of the Major and the Minor subjects chosen by a student. e.g.,

- i. If the Major and the Minor subjects chosen by a student belong to the Humanities & Social Sciences Group, then he/she shall have to choose Multi/Inter Disciplinary subject from one of the rest four broad categories mentioned above provided that the subject is affiliated to the college concerned by the University only with the exception that the subject Environmental Science or Computer Science may be chosen by the candidate irrespective of university affiliation.
- ii. If the Major subject chosen by a student belongs to the Natural & Physical Sciences Group and the Minor subject belongs to the Mathematics, Statistics, Computer Science and Computer Applications Group, then he/she shall have to choose Multi/Inter Disciplinary subject from one of the rest three broad categories mentioned above provided that the subject is affiliated to the college concerned by the University only with the exception that the subject Environmental Science or Computer Science may be chosen by the candidate irrespective of university affiliation.

Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): Students are required to achieve competency in a Modern Indian Language (MIL: Arabic/Bengali/Hindi/Sanskrit/Santali/Urdu) and in the English language with special emphasis on language and communication skills. The courses will emphasize the development and enhancement of skills such as communication, and the ability to participate/conduct discussion and debate.

Modality of selection of AEC: A student shall have to study two (2) courses of any of the above mentioned subjects as MIL in 1st & 3rd semesters and two (2) courses of English language in 2nd & 4th semesters as per the syllabi prescribed by the University or equivalent course(s) of his/her chosen subject as MIL and/or English language from SWAYAM or any

other UGC recognized platform. However, in case regular teaching-learning of none of the six subjects under MIL is done in any college/institute affiliated to BU, that college authority shall arrange regular teaching-learning of Bengali in 1st & 3rd semesters under CCFUP. In spite of that if there is any student in that college/institute who cannot read & write Bengali (to be justified by the respective college authority based on the relevant documents furnished by the student concerned) or if any student is enrolled in a college in any of the above mentioned subjects under MIL which is not affiliated to the college concerned then he/she may, on submission of i) a self declaration regarding self study of the subject concerned, and ii) an application addressed to the Registrar, BU, through the Principal/TIC/OIC of the College concerned along with the remittance of required fees, be allowed exemption from regular study in that subject.

Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): These courses are aimed at developing practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students.

Modality of selection of SEC: A student shall have to study three (3) courses as SEC on his/her respective Major subject in 1st, 2nd & 3rd semesters.

Value Added Course (VAC): These courses aim at enabling the students with the ability to apply the acquired knowledge, skills, attitudes, and values required to take appropriate actions for mitigating the effects of environmental issues, in cutting-edge technologies and seek to promote an optimal state of physical, emotional, intellectual, social, moral, ethical and spiritual values of a person as well as environmental well being.

Modality of selection of VAC: All the enrolled students of 1st semester shall have to study Environmental Science/Education as the 1st course of VAC. Each enrolled students of 2nd semester shall have to study Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports & Fitness as the 2nd course of VAC.

Internship: A key aspect of the new UG programme is induction into actual work situations in the form of Internship/Apprenticeship in a firm, industry, college library (affiliated to BU), or organization or Training in labs under Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes. Students will be provided with opportunities for Internship with local industry, business organizations, health and allied areas, local governments (such as panchayats, municipalities), elected representatives of Parliament or Assembly, media organizations, artists, crafts persons, and a wide variety of organizations so that students may actively engage with the practical side of their learning and, as a by-product, further improve their employability.

Research Project/Dissertation: Students choosing a 4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research) are required to take up research projects at the beginning of 7th semester under the guidance of a faculty member. The students are expected to complete the Research Project in the eighth semester. The research outcomes of their project work may be published in peer-reviewed journals or may be presented in conferences /seminars or may be patented.

Modality: Students who secure CGPA 7.5 and above at semester six and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They are required to do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline.

Awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma, and Degrees:

UG Certificate:

Students who opt to exit after successful completion of the first year (two semesters) and have earned 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer term (preferably from 3rd week of April to 2nd week of June) of the first year as a mandatory requirement. However, such additional credit will not be taken into consideration while computing SGPA/CGPA though it will be reflected in the Grade Card. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme (i.e. in 3rd semester) within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period from original year of enrolment in Sem.-I Examination.

UG Diploma:

Students who opt to exit after successful completion of the second year (four semesters) and have secured 87 credits will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer term (preferably from 3rd week of April to 2nd week of June) of the second year as a mandatory requirement. However, such additional credit will not be taken into consideration while computing SGPA/CGPA though it will be reflected in the Grade Card. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme (i.e. in 5th semester) within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated period from original year of enrolment in Sem.-I Examination.

3-year UG Degree:

Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years (six semsters), securing 128 credits and satisfying the credit requirement as given in U.Reg. (CCFUP) 5.

4-year UG Degree (Honours):

A four-year UG Honours degree in the major subject/discipline will be awarded to those who have completed a four-year degree programme with 178 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as given in U.Reg. (CCFUP) 5.

4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research):

A four-year UG Honours with Research degree in the major subject/discipline will be awarded to those who have completed a four-year degree programme with Research Project/Dissertation with 178 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as given in U.Reg. (CCFUP) 5.


Academic Bank of Credit (ABC):

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR ADMISSIONS

- 1. Both online and offline application for admission to Under Graduate Honours Course in B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com/ BBA/ BCA under NEP CCF-UP curriculum pattern under The University of Burdwan for the Academic Session 2024-25 will be accepted for the candidates qualifying HS or Equivalent Examination in the Year 2024, 2023, 2022, and 2021 for admission.
- **2.** Application Forms, Rules, Regulations, Directives and Online payments will be carried out through the Official Website of the College-Applications forms. Forms will be available offline from the college office counter.
 - For Offline admissions- You may collect the offline application FORM from the college office and after duly filling up, may submit it to the College office along with the Application fee and with the necessary documents. Application forms will be available from campus offices between 10.30am to 4pm.
- **3. FILLING UP OF APPLICATION FORM** –A candidate can apply for any number of Honours courses. Application fees for each course is Rs. 500/-. Payment of application fees is mandatory, otherwise the application will be considered invalid.
- **4. MERIT LIST--** After the last date of online submission of application forms, a provisional merit list of applicants will be published on the College admission portal. In case of any discrepancy applicants are instructed to submit their queries/complaints by contacting the helpline number, which will be available in the College online admission portal within the stipulated time.
- **5. ADMISSION** The applicants applying for online admission should complete the admission process by payment of admission fees and upload necessary documents duly attested within the stipulated time. They should keep all the admission related documents, receipts and acknowledgement slip after the process gets completed.
- **6. PHYSICAL DOCUMENT VERIFICATION** After successful submission of admission fees candidates will be asked to attend the classes according to the schedule to be made available in the College website. Attending of those classes is mandatory for all candidates. Any candidate found to have provided any wrong information will lead to the

- cancellation of their respective candidature at St. Xavier's College, Burdwan. Notice related to document physical verification will be uploaded later on in College website
- 7. CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION AND GENERATION OF TRANSFER CERTIFICATE (TC) For cancellation of admission and issuance of transfer certificate, a candidate will have to apply at the college office.
- **8. REGISTRATION-CUM-ENROLLMENT**: After admission to the 1st Semester the student has to fill up the University of Burdwan's Online Registration-cum-Enrollment Form subject to the relevant notice issued by the College.
- **9.** Admission is granted only to deserving applicants strictly on the basis of Merit.
- **10.** Merit Panel will be prepared based on Merit Score. In no circumstances, the number of applicants admitted will exceed the number of seats approved by The University of Burdwan.
- 11. An applicant is responsible for the data provided in the application form. His/her candidature will stand cancelled if any discrepancy is observed in the information provided at any stage of the admission process and even after the admission process gets over.
- 12. All admissions are PROVISIONAL, until registration of the candidate is finalized by The University of Burdwan. Admission of any candidate shall be cancelled, if found to be in contravention of the University Regulations and Restrictions, or in contravention of any rule framed by the college authorities, even though detected after the completions of admission.
- **13.** In the matter of dispute, the decision of the Head of the Institution will be considered as final and indisputable.
- **14.** Applicants only from boards and councils recognized by The University of Burdwan will be considered valid for admission.

- **8.** Maintain gender equality and help specially-abled fellow classmates within the campus.




The Fundamental Duties of the Citizens

Part IVA Fundamental duties

- (h) to develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform;
- (i) to safeguard public property and to abjure violence;

- (k) who is a parent or guardian to provide opportunities for education to his child or, as the case may be, ward between the age of six and fourteen years
